Dear Senators and Representatives,

The Board of Nursing has reviewed HF 3794 and the proposed amendment which provides that individuals who may operate x-ray systems includes "a qualified practitioner who is licensed by a health licensing board with active practice authority and is working within the practitioner's scope of practice". On February 6, 2020 the Board voted to support the bill and amendment based on the following information.

Minnesota Statute § 148.171, subd. 5, 10, 11, 21 provides that advanced practice registered nurses (APRN) may order, supervise, perform and interpret diagnostic tests except for five specified advanced diagnostic imaging exams. Minnesota Statute § 148.171, subd. 13 provides that APRNs must practice within the scope of their role and population in which they hold Minnesota licensure.



Minnesota Statute § 144.121, subd. 5a. is in direct conflict with the above-mentioned statutes because it authorizes only certified registered nurse anesthetists to operate x-ray systems. This has resulted in confusion and misinterpretation by APRNs and employers of APRNs. The proposed amendment will ameliorate the contradiction in statute and provide APRNs authority to operate x-ray equipment within the scope of their role and population.
